WHAT DOES CFBank DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?

Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

What?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:

- **Social Security number** and **Payment history**
- **Income** and **Credit history**
- **Account balances** and **Checking account information**

How?

All financial companies need to share **Customers** personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their **Customers** personal information; the reasons **CFBank** chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Reasons we can share your personal information	Does CFBank share?	Can you limit this sharing?
For our everyday business purposes — such as to process your transactions, maintain your account(s), respond to court orders and legal investigations, or report to credit bureaus	No	We Don't Share
For our marketing purposes — to offer our products and services to you	No	We Don't Share
For joint marketing with other financial companies	No	We Don't Share
For our affiliates' everyday business purposes — information about your transactions and experiences	No	We Don't Share
For our affiliates' everyday business purposes — information about your creditworthiness	No	We Don't Share
For nonaffiliates to market to you	No	We Don't Share

What we do	
How does CFBank protect my personal information?	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings. We also maintain other physical, electronic, and procedural safeguards of this information.
How does CFBank collect my personal information?	We collect your personal information, for example, when you <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Open an account or ▪ Pay us by check or ▪ Apply for financing or ▪ Give us your income information or ▪ Give us your contact information We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies
Why can't I limit all sharing?	Federal law gives you the right to limit only <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes — information about your creditworthiness ▪ affiliates from using your information to market to you ▪ sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.
What happens when I limit sharing for an account I hold jointly with someone else?	Your choices will apply to everyone on your account

Definitions	
Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. ▪ CFBank has no affiliates.
Nonaffiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. ▪ CFBank does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.
Joint marketing	A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. ▪ CFBank does not jointly market.

Other important information
